

HOPE FOR HAITI

A campaign to raise funds to restore hope for the children of Haiti

The earthquake has left tens of thousands of people dead, and rescuers are continuing an increasingly desperate search for survivors



FEARS DEATH TOLL WILL HIT 200,000

Hope for Haiti has been established by Natascha Yogachandra, a senior at Ruamrudee International School, Bangkok, Thailand

We believe that the world of humanity is a composite body and that when part of the organism suffers all the rest of the body will feel its consequences. The devastation in Haiti will only add to the poverty and hardship already faced by the nation of 8.5 million people, where half of the people are unemployed and around 70% live on less than \$2 dollars a day. After hearing of the destructable earthquake, Natascha, a senior IB diploma student at Ruamrudee International School in Bangkok, has decided to personally visit Haiti in April 2010 with her parents to restore hope; to help repair schools and provide educational materials.

She is traveling there after the initial phase in which major international relief agencies are providing basic needs, such as food, medicine and

shelter. Her goal is to raise US \$50,000 (THB 1.6 milion) and personally visit Haiti to help the victims, especially the children. 100% of donations will be used for the relief efforts.

Haiti's devastation is all too familiar to her. Immediately after the tsunami in 2004, she raised more than US \$20,000 and personally went to the southern part of India and Sri Lanka with her parents to provide relief for the tsunami victims. She was 11 at the time and spent a month comforting and supporting children and established an ongoing project of restoring day care centers.

Haiti's plight is a reminder of our wider responsibilities.
